Graduation Requirements	<p>1. To qualify for graduation, students graduated from law-related departments of the Extended Master Program must enroll and pass compulsory and optional courses and earn at least 32credits (including 4 credits from master dissertation), but students graduated from non-law related departments of the Extended Master Program must enroll and pass compulsory and optional courses and earn at least 44credits (including 4 credits from master dissertation). And all students have to pass examinations listed under the University’s Research Degree Examination Regulation, and pass the Extended Master Program’s Professional Fundamental Competency Assessment.</p> <p>2. Generally, postgraduate students are limited to 25 credits per semester and shall not be less than 1 course(excluding pre-courses and mending courses). The minimum credits requirement aforementioned is not applicable to students who are in their extended period of study, nor to returned students, if one fourth of their required credits is offset. Other exceptional circumstances concerning the credits requirement are subject to the approval by the Head of the Department.</p> <p>3. Credits earned from courses provided by Master Program of other Departments of the School of Law may be included into the graduation credits of the Extended Master Program.</p> <p>4. Approval from and signature of the Dean or supervisor is required for credits earned from optional courses provided by other Departments outside the School of Law to be included into the graduation credits of the Extended Master Program.</p> <p>5. The listed optional courses are provided in accordance with the relevant regulations of the University, and are subject adjustment according to the actual enrollment of each semester.</p> <p>6. The optional courses on this list of compulsory and optional courses can be applied retroactively to students enrolled before the 108th academic year.</p>
